- 2. Agree on a cruising speed before leaving, this should be a speed that is safe for all drivers and ages of vehicles in the group.
- 3. Utilize the FRS radios for communications. Pick a channel and make sure all participants are aware of the channel.
- 4. Have someone designated to bring up the rear of the group. Also make sure that everyone has directions/maps of the cruise if possible.
- 5. Plan on a convenience stop about every 1.5 hours. This will give everyone a chance to visit the facilities and stretch their legs.
- 6. Stop the caravan if a vehicle breaks down. Find a safe place to regroup. Never leave a Corvette owner stranded if they have a vehicle failure.
- 7. Remember, arriving AND returning safely is the primary goal of any cruise.

Now that I have made my public service announcement, I want everyone to have FUN this year.

Also, if you plan on having any adult beverages, please do it in a responsible manner. We want to keep all of our members in one piece and healthy.

<u>C5 Owners Take Note</u> By Ron Floyd

C5's are great road vacuums! They suck up all kinds of road debris underneath the front cover where air flows up and through the radiator. If this debris is not regularly cleaned out it builds to the point of significantly reducing airflow through the radiator and thus significantly reducing the radiators cooling capacity.

Cleaning it out is not hard but does take some care. With a shop vac nozzle and flash light lay just underneath the front cover and gently vacuum out the leaves, pine needles, paper, etc. that builds up at the top of the radiator. Take care not to bend or otherwise damage the radiator fins as the fins are easily damaged.

In my experience, this needs to be done at least twice a year if you put very many miles on your C5!! C4's also tend to experience the same problem but not quite as much.

8:40 pm - V.P. At Large




