

Happy Holidays and Happy New Year from "The Busted Knuckle Garage".


# C4 / C5 Owners Alert...

I've mentioned this in previous newsletters but it does bear repeating, especially at this time of the year when there are even more leaves, pine needles, etc., on the roads. C4's and in particular C5's, are unfortunately, terrific vacuum's, scooping up just about anything from the roads. Problem is that this stuff accumulates on the radiator fins and begins to block the airflow, reducing the engine cooling capability.

At minimum, at least twice a year, one should carefully use the thin/flat nozzle on a shopvac or similar and with a flashlight lay under the front fascia and suck out all the accumulated debris. Do it gently so as to not damage the radiator fins. Your Vette will overheat, sooner or later, if this is not done. If you have never done this, you will be amazed at how much stuff is there.


# <u>LOOKING BACK –</u> <u>Classic Glass 15 Years Ago</u>
