So many people doing this and that to make sure the event went as seamlessly as possible. Even Carl Etter made sure

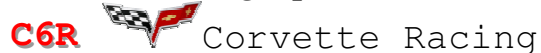
that his folding chair was occupied – just kidding with you Carl. Did you notice too how many of our club members had their families come and look at the show- kids and grandkids alike?

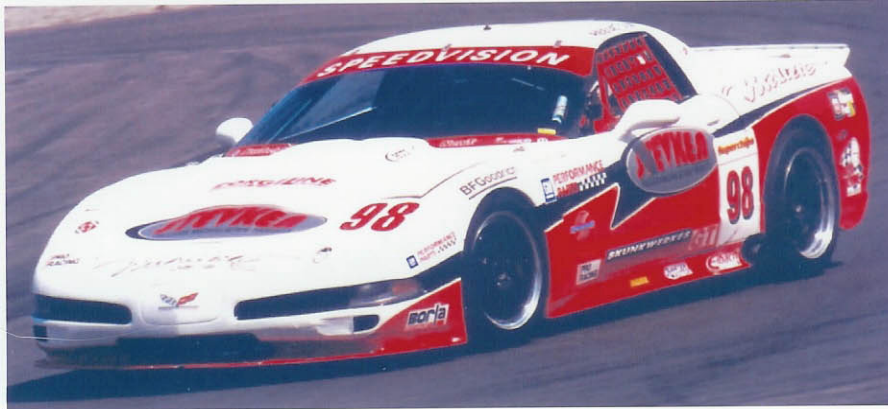
