Classic Glass Corvette Club General Meeting Minutes, February 14, 2012

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by President Greg Brooks. Greg wished everyone a Happy Valentine's Day, and in honor of the day, announced that he had brought two cakes for dessert. He mentioned the Valentine's Cruise this past weekend and congratulated the winners of the "Not-So-Newlywed" Game: first place, Vivian and Frank Macaluso; second place, Rita and Greg Brooks; and third place, Harriette and Bill Majoros. He also revealed a few of the more memorable answers to some of the questions! Really, handcuffs?

Storage Unit: Greg discussed the need for a centralized location to store the boxes of paperwork and other miscellaneous items (e.g., speakers, traffic cones, clipboards, etc.). He has looked into renting a 5'x5' climate-controlled storage unit. The cost is \$49/month (including insurance) and will be on a month-tomonth basis. Because the cost will be more than \$500/year, the expenditure had to be approved by the members. He opened the floor for discussion. One recurring suggestion centered on purging the files of unnecessary documents, then scanning and storing the remainder to disk. One person commented that it might be easier to store hard copies as well as being more economical. Another pointed out that electronic storage of documents doesn't resolve the issue of storing (nonpaper) assets. Because of the potential of flooding, basement storage is not a viable solution. A suggestion to create a record retention policy was met with approval. There was another suggestion to organize the records in plastic containers (instead of cardboard boxes). A concern was voiced

about potential thefts and break-ins at the storage facility; however, another person stated she has stored antiques in a similar fashion for several years with no problems.

During the discussion, Harriette Majoros made a motion to rent a storage unit; however, Greg asked her to wait on the motion until all discussion was complete. Once the discussion was complete, Greg asked for a motion. Harriette Majoros made a motion to rent the storage unit at a cost of \$49/month, and Lilas Pratt seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Restoration Project: Greg announced that information about the Troxel restoration project had been published in a couple of different online publications. The club has garnered good publicity and thanks from all over the world. He then presented Adam and Holly with a photo book of the restoration. Mana Swope, who compiled the photo book, provided details on ordering additional copies. The publisher is offering a 50% discount on orders of 10 or more, for an approximate cost of \$60 per book.

Greg also asked that members bring unexpired canned goods to the meetings to donate to MUST Ministries.

E-Mail: Greg announced today was <u>Day 71</u> of the E-Mail Watch and thanked all members for their support and lack of critical e-mails.

Guest Speaker: Greg introduced Lauren Ham, Special Populations Coordinator with the City of Acworth. Lauren provided information about the Horizon Field, which provides disabled children and young adults the opportunity to participate in athletic events. Jennifer Still noted that the proceeds from the Day's Chevrolet cruise-ins go to the Horizon Field. She thanked the club for their participation at these cruise-ins and also discussed their upcoming car show, Cars, Chrome & Caring, to be held on September 22.

Minutes: Mana Swope announced the minutes from the last meeting were published in the newsletter, and she received no corrections. Harriette Majoros made a motion to accept the minutes, Lilas Pratt seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Lilas Pratt presented the financial report which included specifics about the math error in last month's report.

He will hold a planning meeting in two weeks (Chaz will send an email blast with specifics). Carl also noted that donations are already coming in.

NCM Ambassador: Charlie Koninsky advised that for the month of February, family memberships for the Corvette museum can be purchased for the price of an individual membership (\$50).




