Cruising the Natchez Trace – Phase I

Natchez Trace

On April 27, the Deerings and the Middlesworths departed on a three day adventure that Ron and Carolyn had wanted to experience for years and never got to it – riding the Natchez Trace. The Trace runs from Natchez, Mississippi to Nashville, Tennessee, a distance of 444 miles along the approximate route of the original Old Trace.

We decided to drive the Trace from north to south, starting in Nashville, actually Pasquo, TN. Bill and Frances Middlesworth provided the photographs of our trip.

The Old Natchez Trace was formed and used for centuries by Bison and Native Americans. It became a walking/horse/wagon path by arriving Europeans cutting through the untamed wilderness in the late 1700s and early 1800s as a way to connect the lower Mississippi valley to the more northern population sites. The Trace went into disuse in the 1820s when steam power made upstream navigation on the Mississippi River by steamboat possible. Parts of the original trail are still accessible and some segments are listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The Trace is administered by the National Park Service, headquartered in Tupelo, Mississippi. Riding the Trace took us back to a time when the US was unspoiled and covered with natural forests and wildflowers. When riding the well maintained roadway, there is little evidence of human development as there are no power lines, billboards or other human trappings evident. Trucks are not allowed on the Trace and the 50 mph speed limit is strictly enforced. Wild turkeys, wild flowers and many birds are easily visible along the Trace, especially in the northern section south of Nashville where it traverses valleys and forests over the gently winding two-lane road. There is currently one 15 mile detour around a five mile stretch of the Trace for bridge maintenance until sometime in the spring of 2017. But, even that drive was through beautiful Tennessee countryside with interesting roads.

The natural beauty of the Trace means that there are not the normal conveniences we are used to on today's American roads, such as fuel and food. Everything we Corvette drivers and our navigators need, with one exception, requires exiting the Trace. That one exception is restrooms, which are clean and plentiful at many of the stopping points.

The Park Service provides an online listing of services with the milepost markers. These include lodging, fuel and restrooms, as well as picnicking sites and hiking trails. The top ten most popular stopping points are also listed, making planning the drive fairly simple.

Highlights of our stops included the Gordon House. Built in 1817-1818, it is one of the few remaining buildings on the old Natchez Trace. Other stops included the Tobacco Farm, the Pharr Indian Mounds and the Meriwether-Lewis Memorial. It is easy to make unplanned stops as the areas are clearly marked.

Before entering the Trace, we stopped for lunch at the famous Loveless Café on route 100 in Pasquo. There are quaint shops there where we could spend a little time (and money) while waiting to be called for a great lunch.

Our first night was spent at a wonderful Bed & Breakfast (Inn at Bigby Creek) in Columbia, TN, a short 15 mile ride down TN-50 to the east. That evening we walked around the quaint city square and had dinner at Puckett's restaurant, a local landmark, ending Day One of our adventure.

Day Two took us along the Trace to Tupelo, MS, where we made numerous stops at waterfalls and rest areas. Lunch was in Collinwood, TN, only ¼ mile west of the Trace, at Chad's Family Restaurant. It featured great local food and even better prices. In Tupelo, we stayed in a new Wyndham hotel before heading home on Day Three via Birmingham, AL.

Our Corvettes are so fuel efficient that fuel planning is almost a non-event. We easily made the drive from Marietta to our overnight stop in Columbia and still had over ¼ tank of fuel remaining. A fill-up leaving Columbia the following morning took us to Tupelo and a top-off was sufficient to get us back home to Marietta.

Phase II of the Trace adventure will probably take place in the fall when the temperatures drop a little in the Deep South. We will retrace our tracks to Tupelo and drive the remaining 260 miles of the Trace to Natchez. We might even plan a side trip to Vicksburg. Stay tuned for Part II coming later.

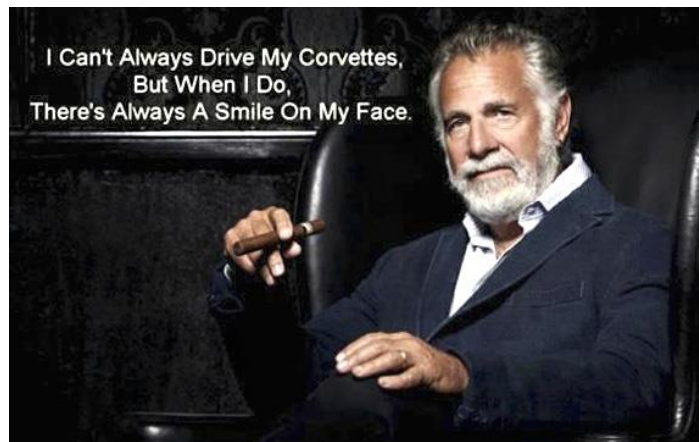
There are a few things you need to be aware of:

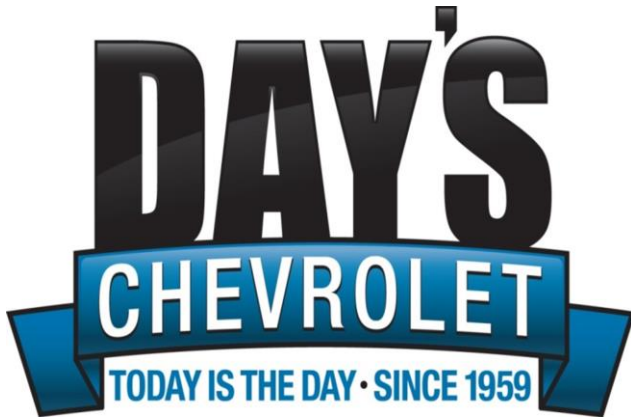


